Die-back

The photo below shows a branch affected by die-back and it nicely illustrates the characteristic linear damage to the bark which has changed colour and cracked as the tree tries to compensate for the death of the end of the branch by making new growth from where the diseased bark starts. Then some of the new growth dies again as shown by the central twig turning brown and orangey. New twigs develop either side of the dead twig in the centre as the tree again tries to continue growing.

Autumn Working Party

On Tuesday 26th September Derek arrived once more with his chainsaw and cut down several more of the trees affected by ash die-back. This was very successful, with only one tree landing straight across the path and needing clearing away immediately. It then rained very heavily the next day but the rain passed and by Saturday we had another pleasant autumn day.



On Saturday 30th therefore, a band of volunteers comprising John and Anne Quinn, Joy and Sean Pendleton, Katherine and Stephen Hutchinson with support from Dave Clapperton and Andy Moore assembled and cleared the trees into nice habitat piles as has become our usual way of spending these pleasant Saturday mornings.

Now as we walk around the wood there is a feeling of more spaciousness and nearly all of the remaining Ash continue to look healthy so we continue to hope they will prove resistant enough to continue to thrive and grow.





We can also see habitat piles of varying ages. The older ones are getting nice fungal growths, flaking bark where insects can live and other signs of the cycle of growth and decay that should be present in balanced woodland. It encourages me greatly that our woodland is playing its small part in the natural world when not all areas are being managed to allow this.



We may have to do a little light thinning of the Oak trees, which have of course been growing more slowly and as a few damaged ones have already been removed this should not be too large a task.

I am hopeful that the constant need to take down and clear so many Ash trees will reduce.
